Thank you to this month's featured Business Partners! and how it is delivered. While the pandemic forced some of these changes when folks were ready or not, we have learned some things that have really worked well and continued on with them.

The use of technology and thinking outside the box was forced upon everyone. While we are all zoomed out, I think we can agree that it opened up a world in which collaboration can happen and it is here to stay. We learned it removes many barriers. When travel, time and cost are all removed from the equation, possibilities are opened for opportunities to learn, share, collaborate and meet. As we wind down the school year and prepare for the next, those questions are just a few to consider. There will most definitely be questions asked of each of us as district leaders. Are you prepared to lead the pack and show off what innovation you have offered your students? While personally, I know there are great things happening in so many districts across the state, from one room schoolhouses to AA districts, it's up to each of us to show off that creativity and how we are using ingenuity to create learners for a world that we don't even know exits yet.

Change is coming and like March of 2020, we might not have time to slowly adjust. There are eyes on us, high expectations and most importantly, there are students whose lives we are shaping. Let's get creative and give our students every opportunity we can to have a successful education which includes rich, hands-on experiences. Let's save families money by granting dual credit. Let's lead the way and show how it is done before we are told how to do it.



#### The Consortium for School Networking

(<u>CoSN</u>) and its Montana state affiliate chapter, <u>Montana Educational Technologists Association (META)</u> are pleased to continue to support the work of current and aspiring superintendents and district leadership teams in leading all aspects of digital learning transformations.

#### CoSN State of EdTech Leadership 2022 Survey

CoSN's State of EdTech Leadership Survey is an annual process to connect with school district technology leaders to gather a high-level sense of the current state of technology implementation within district education systems. 2022 marks the ninth year that CoSN has been pulling together the information around technology trends, challenges and priorities for publication in its annual survey report. CoSN factors in the results of the annual survey to determine how best to support the work of CoSN members.

#### Current priorities revealed in the 2022 survey responses:

Cybersecurity is the number one priority for IT school leaders. Even so, the survey showed that in many cases the districts do not consider themselves to be at a high risk for ransomware attacks. 1:1 initiatives – using school-owned devices – are now being implemented at all grade levels in a growing number of school districts. As with so many aspects of K-12 education, staffing has manifested itself as a challenge for school district IT departments. One area that presents a growing strain for K-12 technology leaders is the ability to provide remote technical support for students and their families. Differences in salaries between rural and urban IT professionals are also referenced in the report as well as upcoming planned retirements of IT school leaders. The survey report confirms that school technology leaders are continuing to work on meeting current standards for network speeds and interoperability. 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
