SAMLN19 Legislative Update 3: Week 3(Jan 21-25) 1-18-19



Greetings SAM Legislative Network 2019 (SAMLN19) Members!

Highlights of Week 2 (Jan 14-18)

The activity of putting together bills to move from draft requests to bill form was very active during the second week of the session. SAM has participated in the discussions of bill language incentivizing Transformational Learning, incentivizing Recruitment and Retention, rework of requests for CTE funding, and finalized a bill that allows loans for school facilities and major maintenance projects with debt payment paid through the Major Maintenance Subfund (now HB 247). You can expect to see each of these efforts come forward as bills in the coming weeks.

You can review <u>SAMLN19 Schedule Week 2 Jan 14-18 Revised 1-11-19</u> for details of the testimony and actions of SAM during week 2. Testimony was given to represent SAM's support for – HB 61, HB 159, and HB 191 in the House Education Committee. In the Senate Education Committee testimony was given to represent SAM's support of – SB 11, SB 12, SB 16, all clean up bills from the Education Interim Committee, and SB 159 (inflation applied to most components of the funding formula). Senate Education Committee to executive action on SB 11, SB 12, and SB 16 sending them to the Senate floor with Do Pass recommendation.

Upcoming Week 3 (Jan 21-25)

<u>SAM Followed Bills</u> now are up to 57 with 240 bill drafts being monitored. Please checkout <u>SAMLN19</u> <u>Schedule Week 3 Jan 21-25 Revised 1-18-19</u> to see the schedule of bills and the status of the SAM's - support, opposition or monitoring - during the upcoming committee hearings. Take note that on Wednesday, Jan 23, at 3:00 pm, the House Education Committee will hold the hearing on HB 27 (Revise special education funding to include placing it in the formula, applying inflation and making the sp ed coop adjustment). This is a SAM priority action bill and so expect a call to action early next week on HB 27.

Section E K-12 scheduled to begin on Thursday, January 24.
