# SAMLN19 Legislative Update 5: Week 5(Feb 4-Feb 9) 2-1-19



Greetings SAM Legislative Network 2019 (SAMLN19) Members!

### Highlights of Week 4 (Jan 28- Feb 2)

The Senate decided to meet on Saturday, Feb 2 creating legislative day 21 for the 66<sup>th</sup> Legislative session. At this point in the session, SAM has provided testimony in Committees 26 times on 22 SAM priority bills. Check out a new report – 2019 Legislative Session SAM Testimony Log 2-1-19 to see review all of the testimony provided up to this point.

Week 4 was busy with hearings on SAM Followed Bills. Review <u>SAMLN19 Schedule Week 4 Jan 28-Feb 2 Revised 1-30-19</u> to see the week's activity.

Week 4 testimony was given to represent SAM's support in the House Education Committee for – HB 211 (address recruitment and retention of K-12 quality educators), HB 247 (provide greater flexibility for school districts in financing major maintenance), SB 11 (clarify age requirements related to the definition of pupil), SB 16 (revise school funding related to special ed joint boards), SB 10 (revise school funding related to major maintenance aid), and HB 218 (generally revise laws related to career and technical education). Testimony was given to represent SAM's support in the Senate Education Committee for – SB 35 (generally revise school safety laws). MT-PEC provided opposition testimony in the Senate Education Committee for SB 132 (creating a student safety and accountability act) because the bill as proposed did not contain amendments recommended weeks ago to broaden protections for youth against sexual abuse in all settings. SAM provided support testimony in the House Human Services Committee for HB 235 (providing options, conditions, for financing school health group plans) – a key SAM priority bill for Recruitment and Retention and School Funding.

In other progress this week, SB 159 (inflation applied to most components of the funding formula) has passed the House and referred to the Senate Finance and Claims Committee awaiting hearing.

### Upcoming Week 5 (Feb 4-Feb 9)

<u>SAM Followed Bills 2-1-19</u> are up to 80 with 251 bill drafts being monitored. Check out a new report – <u>SAM Followed Bills Priority Status 2-1-19</u> describing status of bills under the SAM advocacy priorities – Support Adequate and Equitable School Funding (16 bills), Support Recruitment and Retention of Quality Educators (4 bills), Oppose Privatization with Public Funds (0 bills), Support Facility and Technology Infrastructure (3 bills), and Support School Based Mental Health Services (2 bills).

On Monday, Feb 4 <u>HB 225</u> (revise school laws related to inflation, preschool, and special education) the Governors K-12 funding bill is scheduled for hearing in the House Education Committee. This is a key SAM priority bill for Adequate and Equitable Funding and so activities are planned to support this bill.

- Monday, February 4 at 3:00 PM: House Education Committee Hearing on HB 225 in Room 137. Any and all support from school administrators, teachers, parents, etc. would be great. 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HB 225 will be a Call To Action bill for the SAMLN19 so be ready to contact the member of the House Education Committee.

On Wednesday, Feb 6, HB 351 (encourage transformational learning) will be heard in the House Education Committee. This is a bill that we (MT-PEC) have been working with legislative leaders on with the intent to incentivize school districts who are working on transformational learning strategies for students (like personalized learning, proficiency based learning, etc.). SAM will support this innovative approach for incentivizing our schools.
