# Highlights of Week 7 (Feb 18 - Feb 23)

The House is meeting on Saturday, Feb 23 creating legislative day 39 – the last day to introduce general bills for the 66<sup>th</sup> Legislative session. Week 7 was busy with hearings on SAM Followed Bills and a schedule changed quickly leading up to transmittals on legislative day 45 – March 2, 2019. Review <u>SAMLN19 Schedule</u> Week 7 Feb 18-23 Revised 2-21-19 to see the week's activity.

<u>Bills Followed by SAM Signed by Governor Bullock This Week</u>: <u>HB 61 (Bedey)</u> Revise school data privacy laws, <u>SB 10 (Salomon)</u> Revise school funding related to major maintenance aid, <u>SB 16 (Salomon)</u> Revise school funding related to special education joint boards – all of these bills were supported by SAM.

This week MT-PEC prepared a resource for your use that describes the <u>MT-PEC Recent Legislative Benefit to</u> <u>Public Schools</u>. The resource shows by school district, the total increased annual funding and total annual property tax relief directly attributed to recent bills conceived, drafted and passed by the MT-PEC coalition.

## Monday 2/18/19

#### House Education Committee

Executive Action Taken: <u>HB 351 (McKamey)</u> Encourage transformational learning - passed in committee as amended; <u>HB 398 (Pierson)</u> Require mental health and suicide prevention training in teacher preparation – was tabled in committee, <u>HB 177 (Anderson)</u> Allow school districts to use equalization aid for preschool programs – passed in committee, <u>HB 298 (Pope)</u> Revise funding for students with disabilities – passed in committee.

#### Bill hearing:

• <u>HB 414 (Karjala)</u> Generally revise laws related to school meals – SAM will continue to monitor this bill with the amendment that was made to eliminate the school requirements and sanctions offered in gray bill during the hearing.

#### Wednesday 2/20/19

#### House Education Committee

Executive Action Taken: <u>HB 387 (Jones)</u> Create advanced opportunity act for Montana students – was introduced passed in committee.

Bill hearings:

- <u>HB 420 (Runningwolf)</u> Encourage grow your own programs to address teacher shortage. Good hearing with testimony from several SAM members, OCHE, and SAM provided testimony representing MT-PEC. No opponents to this bill.
- <u>HB 459 (Beard)</u> Provide support for rural school recruitment and retention. SAM provided support testimony along with several rural school district SAM members. No opponents to this bill.
- <u>HB 466 (Bahr)</u> Fund an Indian language and culture course through MT Digital Academy. SAM provided support testimony. No opponents to this bill.

#### House Appropriations Committee

Executive Action Taken: <u>HB 211 (Jones)</u> Address recruitment and retention of K-12 quality educations – passed 19-3. Good news.

Bill hearings:



- <u>HB 218 (Vinton)</u> Generally revise laws related to CTE
- <u>HB 295 (Anderson)</u> Create grant program to encourage work-based learning

# Senate Education & Cultural Resources Committee

Bill hearings

• <u>HB 247 (Grubbs)</u> Provide greater flexibility for school districts in financing major maintenance. This is a SAM priority bill and Rick Duncan provided support testimony.

#### House Business and Labor Committee

Executive Action Taken: <u>HB 413 (Anderson</u>) Address vaping in schools – passed committee as amended causing vapor products to not be allowed on school property even as part of a lecture, demonstration, or educational forum.

## Thursday 2/21/19

A SAMLN19 Call to Action was sent concerning <u>SB 297</u> and <u>SB 298</u> asking members to contact the Senate Education Committee members expressing opposition to these bills. Thank you to all of you who sent this message to the legislators and to those who passed the call to action on to members in your region.

## House Business and Labor Committee

Executive Action Taken: <u>HB 413 (Anderson</u>) Address vaping in schools – passed unanimously as amended (see above).

## Friday 2/22/19

<u>HB 177 (Anderson)</u> Allow school districts to use equalization aid for preschool programs – scheduled for  $3^{rd}$  reading on the House floor.

House Education Committee

Executive Action Taken: None at the time of this publication.

#### Senate Education & Cultural Resources Committee

Executive Action Taken: None at the time of this publication. Bill Hearings:

- <u>SB 146 (Salomon)</u> Revise laws related to an inflationary adjustment for education. Support
- <u>SB 292 (Webb)</u> Revise laws related to financial administration of school districts. Monitor
- <u>SB 297 (Brown)</u> Generally revise laws related to school elections involving property taxes. Oppose as outlined in the Call To Action.
- <u>SB 298 (Brown)</u> Referendum to revise laws related to school elections involving property taxes. Oppose as outlined in the Call To Action.

# Upcoming Week 8 (Feb 25 – Mar 2)

<u>SAM Followed Bills 2-22-19</u> are up to 110 with 257 bill drafts being monitored. <u>SAM Followed Bills Priority</u> <u>Status 2-22-19</u> describes the status of bills under the SAM advocacy priorities – Support Adequate and



Equitable School Funding (19 bills), Support Recruitment and Retention of Quality Educators (5 bills), Oppose Privatization with Public Funds (0 bills), Support Facility and Technology Infrastructure (4 bills), Support School Based Mental Health Services (5 bills), and a new category of Other SAM Followed Bills (26 bills).

Please checkout <u>SAMLN19 Schedule Week 8 Feb 25-Mar 2 Revised 2-22-19</u> to see the schedule of bills and the status of the SAM's - support, opposition or monitoring - during the upcoming committee hearings. The deadline for introducing general bills is Saturday, 2/23 and the transmittal deadline for those bills is a week later on Saturday, 3/2. This creates a flurry of bill activity. You may expect some necessary activity (support from you) happening over this next week.
