- SAM Delegate Assembly Steering Committee (DASC) initiated plans for the development of SAM advocacy for the 2023 legislative session in February. Currently, the SAM 2021 Advocacy Priorities, Positions and Resolutions approved by the SAM membership at the annual business meeting in October 2021 will be revised and recommended for the consideration of the SAM Delegate Assembly 2022 on June 9-10. This will lead to recommendations for consideration of the SAM membership at the annual business meeting in October 2022.

Professional Learning and Services

- Professional learning opportunities for educational leaders aligned with best practices research and innovative strategies.
- The <u>SAM Leaders Professional Learning Program (LPLP)</u> is a best practices professional learning delivery system that personalizes learning for Montana administrators. Over the past 7 years, SAM LPLP has supported 490 administrators in meeting their personalized professional learning needs.
 - SAM LPLP 2020-21 Executive Summary provides specific details of the progress of the 70 SAM LPLP members and 8 Collegial Learning Networks during the 2020-21 school year, with SAM LPLP Providers (coach/mentors) to personalize a professional learning plan enhancing their ability to serve their students, school and community. This program met the needs of personalized professional learning for about 6.4% of our 1100 SAM members.
 - SAM LPLP 2021-22 launched on April 16, 2021, with 56 administrators registered (2/1/22) and 7 <u>CLNs</u> collaborative efforts in progress. Many creative opportunities for personalized professional learning have been developed. <u>SAM LPLP Summit 2021-22</u> on 7/27/21. The Providers report the upsurge in support
