Urge Your Members of Congress to Support the Mental Health of Educators

The bipartisan *Supporting the Mental Health of Educators and Staff Act* would promote evidence-based best practices for preventing suicide and improving mental health among educators, and establish education and awareness initiatives about mental health services among the educator workforce.

The past several years have taken a toll on everyone's mental health. Educator shortages, inadequate working conditions, and campus-wide trauma have hit schools across the country especially hard. The *Supporting the Mental Health of Educators and Staff Act* is an important step to establish structural supports for educators to help them create resilient and thriving school communities. The bipartisan bill was introduced by Rep. Suzanne Bonamici (D-OR), Rep. Brian Fitzpatrick (R-PA), and Rep. Susan Wild (D-PA).
