Jon – Tier 1 – Lion's Slips – students recognize other students or staff, staff recognizing students, staff re Lindsay – Implementation of Olweus

Marie – Meadowlark School Scoop: videos of students saying what their learning goals are **Heather** – survival in B.S.

Jory -- #longhorn Grit – talking about grit and perseverance; put time into a mentoring program; had a long change; out of 30, hired 10 new; understanding our culture

Matt – working on sensory types of things – 17 kids on IEPs – all kindergarten and first grade – trying to build that sensory atmosphere; get them focused and learning; break boxes and sensory corners;

Danny – service council officers; 5th and 6th grade campaigning; 4 LC service council; Facebook Live for the speeches

Mathew – school tools tv – making one minute video's; doing 5 minute videos; Baruti Kafele – SOAR Café...taking a group of boys and girls that are Tier 3 for 15 minutes and taking them right away in the morning with the videos; working on self-regulation; starting their day on the right

Holly – doing a huge Google Camp; creating a Maker-Space – had several people from different countries take part; working on growth mindset;

Ryan – grant work from Montana Comprehensive Reading Grant; doing MBI; designing a new school; moving his school at Spring Break;

Rhonda – starting a new school, 90% into her school;

Luke – working on MBI; Eagle Tickets to SOAR Tickets; relating the data back to safety

Rae – Dr. Suess – each grade level picked a Dr. Suess book; working on the growth mindset; working on fixed vs. growth mindset;

Carole – working on setting goals for reading in the classroom;

Kim D. – revamping MBI; updated some things at Morningside; we are a pilot school; we have a self-contained academic setting...no matter what titles or categories, kids go where they go for instruction that is needed; open the door for taking down barriers with labels and getting what they need; it has been very positive for teachers; opened their doors and the staff has been positive; each school will have a possible structured learning classroom if the pilot goes well; students are going in and out and the parents are loving it so far

Kim R. – working on a new safety system with locking doors; the program she started Watch Dogs...dad's volunteer for the time they can be there; spend time in their child's classroom also; build the volunteer basis; walk the halls and surrounding...for example, propping a door for outside;

Topics for Discussions:

- 1) Infinite Campus using the app Clever working with Infinite Campus...syncs as often as you want uploads MAP and SBAC
- 2) **High Needs and Self-Contained Students** GFPS has different set up...talk with Kim R. and Luke D. Lewistown put 5 para's into their 5 classrooms to support with behavior; assigned to a classroom; has scheduled a para to go with some students; spread out kids that are high needs into the 5 classrooms; working on inclusion; reconfigure spaces in classrooms in Lewistown; we have a space issue; we have so many 1:1's we have a 1:1 problem; finding people to cover these positions; they have been go-getters that we have hired so far; hiring pool different between GF and Lewistown; Resource teacher helping plan for the students in the classroom...replacement curriculum and still be included in the classroom;
- 3) Students who repeatedly break the rules, how do you handle these students? -- working with getting baseline data, collecting frequency, duration, and intensity collecting the data from school pysch and getting SRO involvement; shortened days schedule; IEP invite parents and reverse OSS with parents coming in; work to find if it is choice driven vs. innate; earns time back in; moving towards a full day; making it uncomfortable for him; forced choice survey a two page survey to find out what they will work for; find out what motivates her;
- 4) Structured Playground Time sometimes it's our counselor or PE teacher go outside and play games that are structured; may be working in small group if they are having problems; work in progress; PE teacher works with students right before recess...keeps the game rolling from inside to outside; working on rules;
- 5) Supporting New Teachers mentor programs; grade level meetings every week in Havre built into their week; district level coaches and academic coaches; taken a huge cut in GFPS; use to be weeklong training to a couple a couple days; coaches working with teachers; new teacher blog; wordpress.com or Google Classroom
