

APRIL 2021 MASS MEETING UPDATES FROM THE OPI

Below are key talking points from the OPI Executive Staff to be shared with the MASS Regions AS OF 3.29.2021

ESSER II & ESSER III -Funding

The DOE is reserving 1/3 of the ESSER III funds (ARPA) until the State Plan is submitted and approved. Local districts it sounds like, will also have to have plans on use of funds and addressing requirements of ESSER III. Stay tuned for future webinars on this topic.

ASSESSMENT WAIVER

The OPI does not have a response from the DOE related to the Assessment Waiver submitted in February. However, the accountability template submitted March 25, 2021, was approved and provides for accountability waivers, including the 95% participation rate on assessments. The requirement to assess has not yet been waived. Districts are encouraged to continue providing the opportunity to assess, while ensuring that student safety and well-being is your #1 priority.

Secretary Cardona, in a speech he gave on 3.23.2021 to State School Chiefs, made the following key points:

- Context Matters
- One size fits one
- Assessment is more for the policy makers and decisions for the allocation of ARPA funding with a high priority on addressing inequities.
- Assessment waivers from state chiefs are being carefully reviewed related to context and the needs identified by the States.

In the future, we need to re-examine the role of assessment. This is simply not the year for a referendum on assessment.

The OPI is working diligently on two pieces that we believe will begin the future of what Montana assessment can imagine:

- 1. Potential Metametrics contract by which the varied forms of assessment used at the local level can be collected and summarized providing a state view on student growth.
- 2. Opportunity to Learn Survey for Students and Teachers to be distributed May 1 May 30 to inform the OPI and legislators on the impact of COVID on learning through the student and teacher lens. This survey is critical to our ability to answer DOE questions related to student learning and funding uses by the State and districts. Your help in ensuring this survey is successfully distributed, is much appreciated. It is anticipated that the survey will be sent to you by mid-April along with a parent letter.
