Strengthening Claims Based-Interpretations and Uses of Local and Large Scale Science Assessments

OPI to Begin Work on New, Large Scale Science Assessment

The Assessment Division is launching its work toward a new large-scale science assessment with its Theory of Action face-to-face meeting in Helena on November 13.

In 2016, the US Department of Education (US DOE) awarded an Enhanced Assessment Grant (EAG) to the "Strengthening Claims-Based Interpretations and Uses of Local and Large-Scale Science Assessments" (SCILLSS) project. Montana, Wyoming and Nebraska were identified as state partners for this work. The multi-state SCILLSS grant will help the OPI indentify a "Theory of Action" and framework using principled design approaches to create measureable and useful scores from defined assessment claims. In addition, the SCILLSS grant will help the OPI leverage work from other states and vendors while building our local capacity.

Montana will work toward a comprehensive system of assessments for science through a staged process which requires significant input from stakeholders. To support our end goal (identifying meaningful and actionable data to monitor progress over time), the OPI will share it's draft "Theory of Action" for comment.

The meeting will include members from the SCILLSS project, OPI Staff and members of the external Science Partner Task Force. This will be the first of many meetings to come regarding this important topic. Things to do this month

- Beginning November 6, 2017, Test Coordinators will begin managing participation and shipping dates in Pearson Access (PA Next). Management in PA Next will be required this year. The deadline date for this activity is December 1, 2017. Watch for upcoming information from ACT State Testing.
- November 6, 2017 through February 2, 2018 The window for requesting ACT approved accommodations on the ACT for eligible examinees through the Test Accessibility and Accommodations System (TAA). - Load students and instructors into ACT Online Prep (AOP). Instructions for AOP are below.

ACT Online Prep (AOP)

The ACT Online Prep platform is available to begin loading student and instructor records. New administrators for ACT received an email from noreply@onlineprep.act.org with instructions for establishing your account. Returning administrators did not receive an activation email. Your login credentials from last year will provide access to the platform.

ACT State Testing Website

The State Testing website helps ACT Test Coordinators focus on tasks for each stage of the testing program. On the site there are outlines of the information you'll need for each stage. The stages include:

- Orientation
- Configuration
- Verification
- Preparation
- Administration
- Transportation
- Interpretation

We are in the first stage, 'Orientation'. Districts and schools should be focusing on becoming familiar with the testing program, the Schedule of Events and selecting testing staff.

Also note "What's New With ACT Testing?", on the State Testing website. This year, ACT is introducing English learner (EL) supports. Qualifying EL students will earn college-reportable ACT scores. The supports are designed to help EL students accurately demonstrate what they have learned in school. Like accommodations, these supports will need to be managed through the Test Accessibility & Accommodations System (TAA). 

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National and International Assessment Studies

NAEP Results

We anticipate results for the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP), also known as *The Nation's Report Card* sometime in the spring of 2018. This vital state-level data collection is conducted every two years and provides Montana with information on how our students perform compared to other jurisdictions. As part of the NAEP 2017 program, students participated in mathematics, reading, and writing assessments at grades 4 and 8.

In 2017, NAEP selected roughly a third of our public schools and of the sampled students, approximately 80% were tested with tablets and the remaining 20% were tested with the paper and pencil version of the test. Due to the competing needs of the NAEP program, some extra time was needed to analyze the different modalities (tablet and paper) and to ensure the NAEP trend line was preserved.

Q: What is the NAEP Assessment?

A: NAEP, or the National Assessment of Educational Progress, is often called the "Nation's Report Card." It is the largest continuing and nationally representative test of what our nation's students know and can do. It is used to examine trends across the nation in order to help states make decisions that help improve instruction.

Q: Why is NAEP moving to tablets for most students?

A: Tablets allow NAEP to administer new types of test items, including simulations and scenarios that add depth to our understanding of what students know and can do. Many states also administer computer-based assessments. This also helps NAEP leverage the increasingly important role digital tools play in today's classrooms and assessments.

Q: Why is NAEP administering paper tests to some students?

A: NAEP will examine whether results from paper tests and tablet tests are comparable in order to understand how to report NAEP trend results for mathematics and reading. This also allows NAEP to examine comparability across testing modes and to understand how to report trend results.

Q: Will I get to see individual student or school results?

A: No. There are no individual student results or school results for NAEP. To explore NAEP questions, visit the <u>NAEP Questions Tool</u>, sample test <u>Booklets</u>, or the <u>NAEP website</u>. The 2017 results for the state will be released in early spring of 2018.
