 - The MQEC Board of Directors consisting of several SAM member superintendents and associations are preparing to protect the education provisions of the Montana Constitution as applied to the implementation of SB 410 (2017 Tuition Tax Credit bill). Click <u>HERE</u> for more details. The Montana Supreme Court heard the <u>Espinoza et al. v. Montana Department of Revenue</u> case on April 6, 2018 in Missoula. On December 12, 2018, the Montana Supreme Court issued a favorable decision in Espinoza et al., finding <u>15-30-3111 MCA</u> (the tax credit for donations to private schools) unconstitutional. <u>Read the decision here</u>.

- 5. Professional Learning and Services
 - Professional learning opportunities for educational leaders aligned with best practices research and innovative strategies.
 - The <u>SAM Leaders Professional Learning Program (LPLP) 2018-19</u> is a best practices professional learning delivery system that personalizes learning for Montana administrators now in its fifth year. Currently, 54 administrators are in the LPLP forming <u>Collegial Learning Networks</u> with coach/mentors to personalize a professional learning plan enhancing their ability to serve their students, school and community! - The <u>SAM office transition and restructure 2019</u> is currently being implemented. The SAM Executive Board will be considering a recommendation for the SAM office structure for 2019-20 at their March meeting.
- YH Advisors (Brian Yacker, Partner), are working well with support for payroll, bookkeeping, and tax completion services this assists with our financial operation and with internal controls important to the viability of our finances. Currently working to complete 2017 Taxes for SAM and MASS.
- SAM continues implementation of association management software (MemberClicks) upgrading our website, database and tools for all SAM members. Web-based communication tools for the use of our Members include: 1. E-Lists to be used as a notification tool in which responses are emailed to an entire affiliate.
